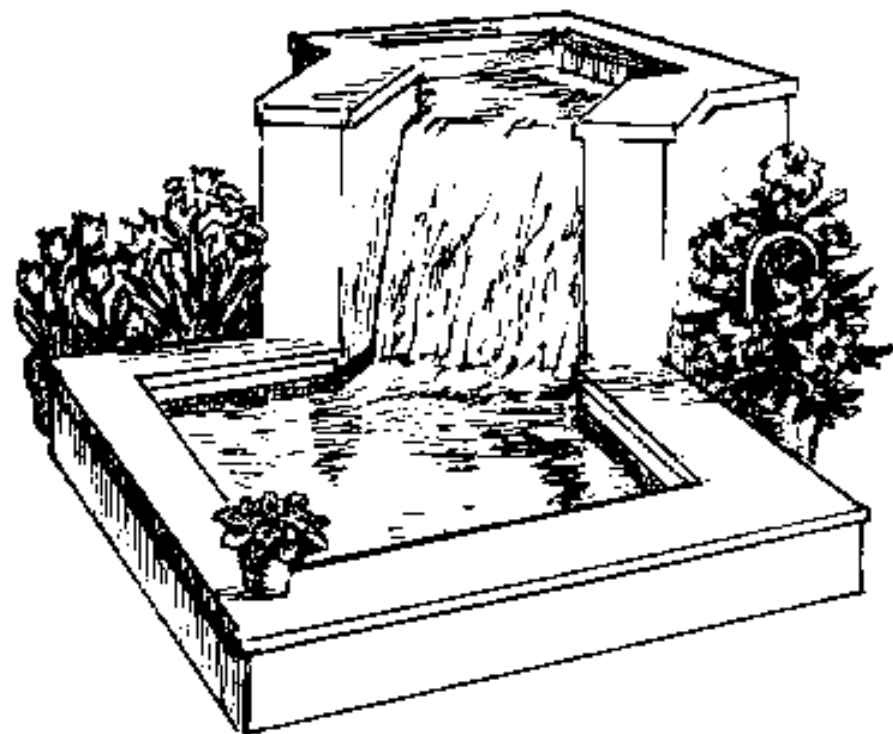

- meets and follows the guidelines of the General Directory for Catechesis and the National Catechetical Directory
- uses texts that are in accordance with the Catechism of the Catholic Church

## POLICIES FOR CHILDREN'S FORMATION SESSIONS:

### A. Attendance:

- Faithful attendance is expected at all sessions and special events.
- Your child's consistent presence is important to the group as a whole and to the catechist.
- After two consecutive absences you will be called to see if there is a problem.

### B. Time:

- Please see that your child is on time.
- Please escort younger children to and from their rooms.
- If your child is to be picked-up by someone other than a parent, please advise the Director of Faith Formation.
- Please pick-up your child on time.

### C. Cancellation of Sessions:

- Notice of cancellation of sessions because of inclement weather will be made through announcements on the local radio station - WXHC-101.5 FM, or on Channel 3 or 5, Syracuse TV stations.
- Email notices will be sent out to all parents who have entered an email address on the registration form.

## The Role of the Parent/Guardian

Children's faith is first formed within the family. "The role of parents... is of such importance that it is almost impossible to provide an adequate substitute" (Declaration on Christian Education #3-Vatican II). Parents/guardians thus have the primary duty of forming the faith of their children. Through faith formation programs and in other ways, the rest of the Christian community assists you in this important role. But, this only supplements the fostering of faith in the home; it does not and *cannot* replace it.

Being instrumental in your child's faith formation helps you grow in your own faith. Toward this end, St. Margaret's offers parent sessions, adult formation opportunities and formation sessions for children. This handbook details opportunities within our Faith Formation Process.

## POLICIES FOR CHILDREN'S FORMATION SESSIONS:

### D. Fee:

- \$45 per child. An additional \$5.00/child enrolled for 1<sup>st</sup> Communion is required (2<sup>nd</sup> Grade) to cover extra expenses.
- If for some reason you feel you cannot pay the fee let the Director of Faith Formation know so that you will not receive a reminder notice.
- No child will be deprived of Faith Formation because of financial concerns.

## SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

### Baptism: (children up to age 7)

- If you desire Baptism for your children you should be a participating, registered member of your Parish Community.
- Parents attend a session on the Sacrament of Baptism to insure understanding of the sacrament, the parental commitment it entails, and for help in preparing you for its celebration.

### Baptism: (children age seven & older)

- Children's Catechumenate: for any child in the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade or older who has not received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Reconciliation or First Eucharist.

### First Eucharist:

- Your child should demonstrate a longing for the Sacrament through regular attendance at Mass.
- It is recommended that your child has completed a full year of Faith Formation or parochial school.
- Parent sessions are provided to help you grow in your understanding of this sacrament and to assist you in preparing your child.

## CONFIRMATION

Confirmation is a step toward a deeper knowledge and appreciation of Jesus Christ and the Church. It is also the final step of initiation into full membership in the Catholic Church. The Sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated in the fall of eleventh grade. We do not assume all teens wish to be confirmed. The signs of readiness as determined by the Diocese of Syracuse are:

- a personal faith consciousness indicated by some type of personal prayer life & awareness of God in her/his life
- an appreciation of Scripture as a unique aspect of God's revelation & as an invitation to an ongoing relationship
- a communal faith consciousness-as indicated by participation in the faith community according to ability
- a sense of service-as indicated by participation in service within the parish and larger community
- a sense of Christian identity-as indicated by participation in the faith formation process or other faith opportunities.

Confirmation calls for a personal decision on the part of the candidate. Therefore, a Confirmation retreat provides the time necessary for the candidate to reflect on the process and the meaning of the Sacraments in their life. The retreat is mandatory.

**Come and Join the Youth Choir**  
***"To Sing Is To Pray Twice"***

One of the ways to learn about our faith is through music (and it's more fun). Through music we:

- learn the Bible stories
- learn the parts of the mass
- learn to praise God
- learn to give our gifts through commitment to our parish family celebrations

Over the years, we have successfully incorporated music into our Faith Formation program. We have also tried to offer the opportunity for a grade 3 -6 youth choir. We have found that without strong parental support and encouragement it has been difficult to continue having a choir. Young voices are light and soft, so it is important to have at least 15 choir members.

In order to have a successful choir, we will need scheduled practices. The goal is to sing 4 times during the Faith Formation year. The rehearsals are usually after the 10:30 mass from (11:30 to 12:15), the 2 Sundays prior to the mass in which they sing.

In the fall children in grade 3-6 will receive a letter inviting them to join the youth choir. It will include dates and times. Parents, please encourage your child to join the youth choir.

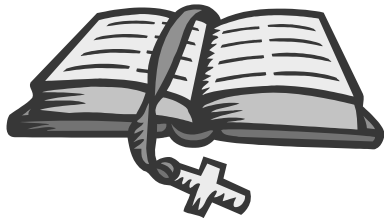
